What do we need to do this year?

This is a quick guide to some of the things we will be concentrating on over the next school year to make the school even better.

Literacy Leader: Miss O'Doherty

- Improve fluency in reading using effective phonics teaching and Bug Club reading resources.
- Promote a reading culture across the school.
- Daily reading across the curriculum using the 'Reading Rainbow' lenses to explore texts in detail.
- Children to know and confidently use the different lenses of writing from the 'Writing Rainbow' in a piece of independent writing.
- Ensure challenge for all learners in all lessons.

Behaviour and Safety Leaders: Miss Adnyana and Mrs Edmonds-Chappell

- Ensure the children know how to keep themselves safe both in school and outside within the context of our school rules.
- Teach children about the school values and how this contributes to us being a 'KIND' school.
- Ensure the children know how to keep safe online.
- Sharing regular updates from the *National Online Safety* organisation, and other key safety messages, with parents/carers.

Health and wellbeing Leaders: Miss Adnyana and Mrs Beckles

- Provide children with opportunities to explore and express feelings and emotions during Circle Times and PSHE lessons.
- Teach children how to lead healthy and active lifestyles, particularly after the restrictions during the pandemic.
- Teach children about wellbeing and what it means to be mentally healthy, along with how to seek support if they need it.
- Develop representation of our diverse community within the school curriculum.

Maths Leader: Mr Jasper

- Improve fluency with addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts using *Number Sense Maths*, *Mastering Number*, *Times Table Rock Stars* and *Sumdog*.
- Continue to improve variation across the school.
- Ensure challenge for all learners in all lessons.
- Ensure children can explain their learning.

Curriculum Leader: Mrs Ruparelia

- Ensure all subject areas provide challenge for all learners.
- Use Cornerstones topics to plan exciting, relevant and meaningful learning opportunities.
- Ensure opportunities for investigative science lessons.
- Plan engaging activities to introduce new learning.
- Ensure full coverage of all areas of the National Curriculum.
- To continue to implement the black curriculum to all subject areas.

Computing Leader: Mrs Kreczman

- Ensure children are confident using a range of devices, including iPads, Chrome books, PCs.
- Ensure they use these devices safely.
- Become more confident in using programs in school.
- Ensure children have a healthy computing curriculum using a range of devices and programmes.
- Ensure the secure use of G-Suite for education in KS1 & 2.
- Introduce the use of Google Classroom for all home learning.
- Update the computing curriculum so that it is compatible with our increased chrome books use in school.

PE and Sports Leader: Mr Coppin

- Ensure children are engaged in regular exercise.
- Increase participation in sports clubs across the school post-pandemic.
- Take part in a range of inter borough competitions and sporting events when they start up again.
- Increase the percentage of active lessons during the school day.

Early Years Foundation Stage

Leader: Mrs Levi

- Implement the new statutory framework for the early years foundation stage.
- Develop outdoor learning across the two school sites.
- Teach children how to manage their feelings and how these impact on others.
- Support children with English as an additional language in the early years.
- Develop the children's fine motor skills.
